How do I track Brexit legislation?

To track the progress of UK legislation introduced in connection with Brexit, see [Brexit legislation tracker](#). It includes a [Brexit SI database](#) collating details of draft and made Brexit SIs.

How do I find out if a piece of legislation is impacted by Brexit?

The [Brexit SI database](#) within the [Brexit legislation tracker](#) (linked on LexisPSL homepages) contains a search filter that enables customers to do this and generate a list of relevant Brexit SIs. The actions are as follows:

- Download the latest version of the database from LexisPSL in excel
- To view the impact on domestic legislation, scroll to column H (amended UK enactments) and type eg Data Protection Act 2018 into the filter - This will generate a list of draft and made Brexit SIs which contain amendments to that legislation. From there you can filter further to narrow the list down eg just to made Brexit SIs or save a copy of the list
- To view the impact on retained EU legislation, scroll to column I (amended EU enactments) and type eg Regulation (EU) 2016/679 into the filter - this will generate a list of draft and made Brexit SIs which contain amendments to that legislation, which again you can filter or save
- To double check for SIs which contain repeals and revocations to domestic or retained legislation (but which do not otherwise amend that legislation), you can conduct the same search filter under column J (Repeals and revocations)

The database contains links to all the SIs so you can read through the original. It also contains links to the various SI summaries, which include further details of the legislation, with links to the original SI and Explanatory Memorandum for more information.

Note on commencement: Under EU VOA 2020, such SI references to 'will do' in the commencement provisions of SIs made under EU VOA 2020 are to be read as references to 'in completion day' unless that provision expressly states otherwise. To check the status of a Brexit SI:

- Filter column B to find relevant SI, or
- Search (ctrl 'F') for the relevant SI

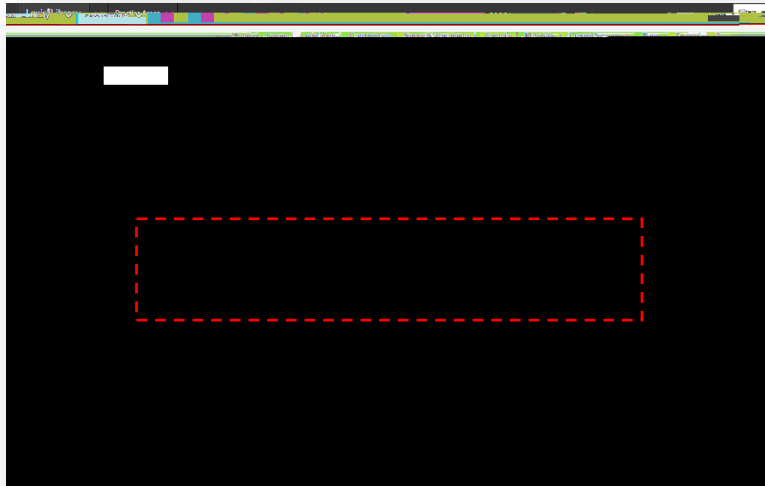
The information in column A will confirm whether the SI is a draft or made.

In some cases, a Brexit SI may be subject to amendments by later Brexit SIs. You can use the filters in columns H and J to check.

To view the consolidated amendments, refer to the relevant legislation in [LexisLibrary](#).

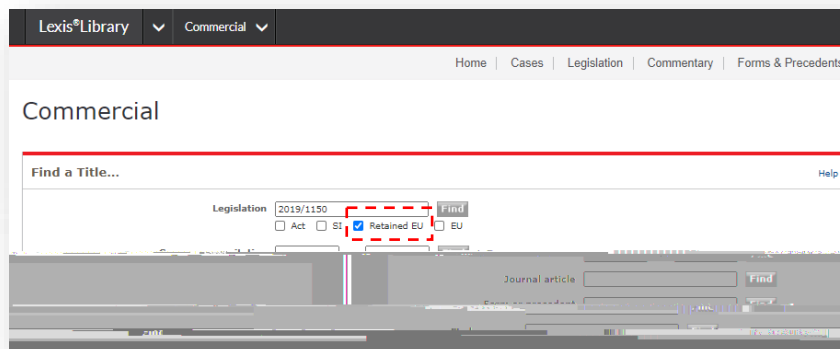
The amendments are incorporated into the text of the relevant legislation, at provision level. The notes segment at the end of each page provides further detail of the changes that have been made to the text.

Further information on the format of the amendments consolidation is available in the legislation source guides in LexisLibrary.

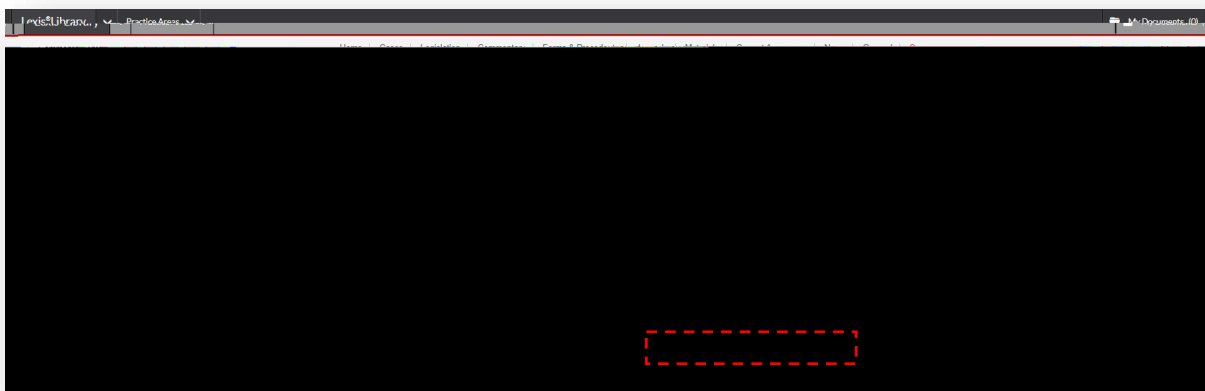


How do I find and view Retained EU Legislation in LexisLibrary?

You can find Retained EU Legislation by searching for Retained EU using radio button for 'Retained EU':

How do I know if a piece of EU legislation is retained in UK law?

The Retained EU legislation sources are not a verified source of retained EU law, but a consolidated source of relevant EU instruments (as defined in the legislation), which may or may not be retained going forward.

Determining the status, applicability and treatment of EU legislation in UK law after IP completion day is a matter of statutory interpretation. Legislation content in these sources must therefore be read alongside the European Union (Withdrawal) Act 2018 (as amended), the Interpretation Acts, and associated legislation and authority.

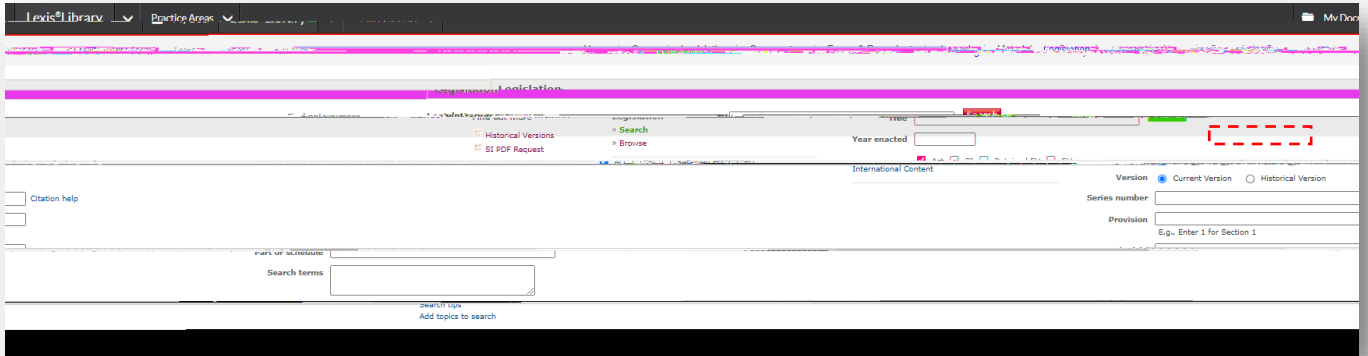

Tip: If amending legislation has been introduced in relation to the instrument you are looking at (using the powers to correct deficiencies in retained EU law under [EU\(W\)A 2018](#)), this may give you a head start, by confirming that it is considered to be in scope of retained EU law (to some extent), subject to the amendments, repeals and revocations specified.

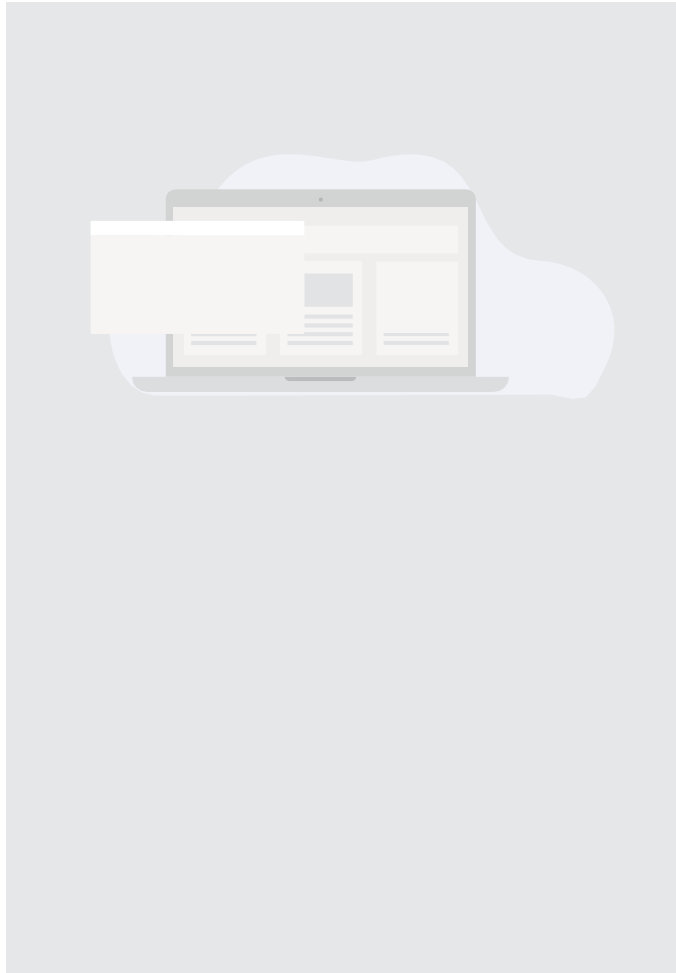


How do I view 'saved' provisions when a piece of legislation is revoked?
