What is Retained EU Legislation and why is it needed?

Retained EU Legislat on is a new category of legislat on content added to our products in light of Brexit. This content has been added to ref ect the expansion and modif cat on of the UK statute book under the European Union (Withdrawal) Act 2018 (EU (W)A 2018), including the conversion and preservat on of EU-derived legislat on in UK law.

Prior to Brexit, EU law took ef ect in the UK via the European Communit es Act 1972, which was repealed by EU (W)A 2018, s 1 at the point of the UK's exit from the EU (exit day). This repeal was subject to savings and transit onal provisions introduced so that EU law could cont nue to apply in the UK during the transit on period provided for in the Withdrawal Agreement between the UK and the EU.

For cont nuity, and to avoid a legal vacuum at the end of the transit on period, EU (W)A 2018 takes a snapshot of EU law applicable in the UK at the end of transit on (ie the point at which EU law ceases to apply in the UK—referred to in EU (W)A 2018 as 'IP complet on day'), bringing it into the UK domest c legal regime as a new category of law—retained EU law.


Retained EU law is a legal concept describing a range of EU-derived legislat on, rights, decisions and principles preserved in UK law af er Brexit. It is a complex and wide-ranging legal term, def ned under EU (W)A 2018. However, there are limits and except ons to what is retained, and the UK government has powers to introduce amendments in domest c law under EU (W)A 2018.




