## What is Retained EU Legislat on and why is it needed?

Retained EU Legislat on is a new category of legislat on content added to our products in light of Brexit. This content has been added to ref ect the expansion and modif cat on of the UK statute book under the European Union (Withdrawal) Act 2018 (EU (W)A 2018), including the conversion and preservat on of EU-derived legislat on in UK law.

Prior to Brexit, EU law took ef ect in the UK via the European Communit es Act 1972, which was repealed by EU (W)A 2018, s 1 at the point of the UK's exit from the EU (exit day). This repeal was subject to savings and transit onal provisions introduced so that EU law could cont nue to apply in the UK during the transit on period provided for in the Withdrawal Agreement between the UK and the EU.

For cont nuity, and to avoid a legal vacuum at the end of the transit on period, EU (W)A 2018 takes a snapshot of EU law applicable in the UK at the end of transit on (ie the point at which EU law ceases to apply in the UK—referred to in EU (W)A 2018 as 'IP complet on day'), bringing it into the UK domest c legal regime as a new category of law—retained EU law.

Retained EU law is a legal concept describing a range of EU-derived legislat on, rights, decisions and principles preserved in UK law af er Brexit. It is a complex and wide-ranging legal term, defined under EU(W)A 2018. However, there are limits and except ons to what is retained, and the UK government has powers to introduce amendments in domest c law under EU(W)A 2018.

The Retained EU Legislat on content is designed to provide users with access to a bespoke source of relevant EU-derived legislat on content, including maintained legislat on of cont nued domest c relevance and archived legislat on of historic relevance. This source is separate to our exist ng EU legislat on content, which is separately maintained in order to ref ect the cont nued development of EU law.

It is important to note that not all legislat on in the Retained EU Legislat on sources will necessarily form part of UK domest c law. Whether a part cular piece or provision of EU legislat on is retained (and to what extent) is a mat er of statutory interpretat on. Further guidance on retained EU law is available in LexisPSL.







## Interpreting the Retained EU Legislation content

Determining the exact status of a part cular piece or provision of EU-derived legislat on in domest c law post-Brexit is a mat er of statutory interpretat on.

EU (W)A 2018 makes provision for the publicat on of all relevant EU instruments which may or may not retained in domest c law af er the transit on period ends. The Retained EU Legislat on sources are consistent with this approach and should not be treated as an authorised or exhaust ve source of retained direct EU legislat on.

Not all legislat on in the Retained EU Legislat on sources will form part of UK domest c law transit on. EU (W)A 2018, and associated Brexit-related legislat on, contain provisions which determine and modify the domest c scope and applicat on of retained EU law.

Our Retained EU Legislat on sources should be read in this context, alongside EU (W)A 2018 and associated legislat on. To assist, direct EU legislat on content contained in our Retained EU Legislat on sources will be consolidated with UK amendments where applicable, with version t meline and amendment highlights enhancements.

EU (W)A 2018 as originally enacted provided for the full repeal of the European Communit es Act 1972 and the introduct on of retained EU law to take ef ect on exit day. These provisions were amended by the European Union (Withdrawal Agreement) Act 2020, to take account of the transit onal arrangements under the Withdrawal Agreement—deferring their ef ect unt I the end of transit on (IP complet on day).

Users will st II be able to access the Retained EU Legislat on sources in advance, while cont nuing to refer to the EU Legislat on sources as normal. Both sets of sources will cont nue to be maintained to ref ect any addit ons and changes introduced by the EU during the transit on period.
